Wishes Are Medicine

We Are Improving Health Outcomes for Canadian Children

Every day across Canada, children are facing critical illnesses that no child should have to endure. In these moments, strength and resilience matter — *and so does hope*. With your support, children receive something research shows is a powerful part of their care: a prescribed wish that supports their medical journey and reminds them they are so much more than their diagnosis.

This year, we introduced ***Wishes Are Medicine***, a platform inspired by decades of evidence showing that a wish can ease stress, improve emotional well-being, strengthen treatment compliance, and even reduce emergency room visits. More importantly, it reflects what families and care teams have long known — that wishes bring comfort, confidence, and renewed energy at a time when children need it most. Wishes belong within the continuum of care, helping children and their families navigate the challenges of illness and treatment with greater strength.

In 2025, together we fulfilled wishes for **1,835 children in 697 communities** across Canada. Guided by a thoughtful approach to financial stability and sustainable wish granting, we continued to deliver deeply personal, high-quality wishes while planning responsibly for the future. Because of the generosity of donors, volunteers, fundraisers, and partners like you, we reached \$54.48 million in revenue this year, with 70.4% of expenses going directly to making wishes come true.

Our commitment remains unwavering: to reach every eligible child in Canada with the healing benefits a wish provides. With a shared belief that **wishes are a vital prescription** for children facing critical illness, your partnership makes this possible.

Thank you for standing with wish kids and their families. Through your generosity, children across Canada experience moments of laughter, comfort, and renewed strength — gifts that heal in ways traditional medicine alone cannot, because ***Wishes Are Medicine***.

1 Child Receives Critical Illness Diagnosis

Families begin to navigate a complex and overwhelming diagnosis, often alongside urgent medical decisions.

2 Treatment Plan Includes Wish Referral

Alongside treatments such as chemotherapy and pain management, doctors develop a care plan that includes a wish — supporting resilience, and emotional well-being during treatment.

3 Wish Planning Provides Strength

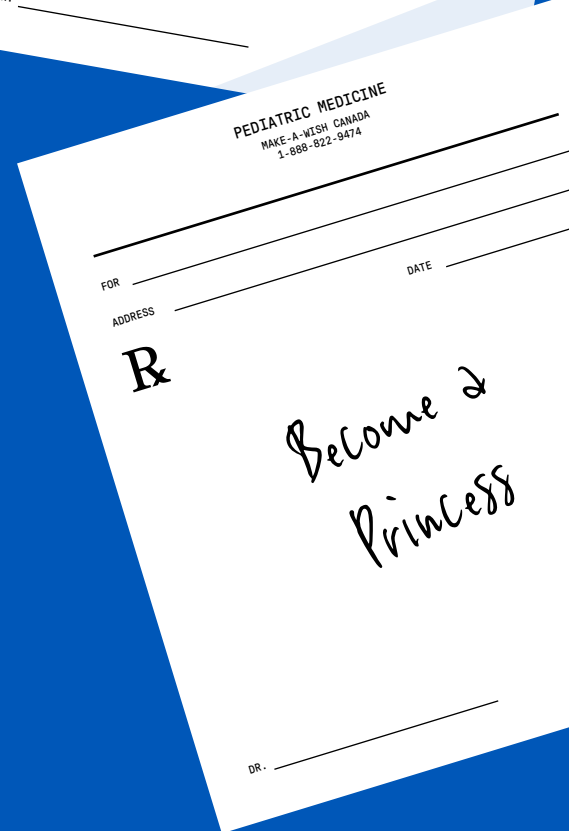
Wish planning often takes place during treatment, helping children build strength, motivation, and resilience through the most challenging moments.

4 Donation Support Makes Wishes Possible

Through the support of a caring community, children are surrounded by hope as their wish journey begins — reinforcing that they are not facing treatment alone.

5 Wishes Deliver Lasting Health Benefits

Critically ill children who experience a wish can experience immediate and lasting health benefits, including measurable reductions in cortisol levels, as well as lasting psychological improvements like decreased depression and anxiety and increased self-esteem, confidence, and hope.

Millie's Prescription: A Wish as Part of Her Treatment Plan

Not All Medicine Comes in a Bottle

By the time Millie could crawl, she had already spent more time in hospitals than many adults will in their lifetime. What began as a few puzzling symptoms quickly stacked into a pattern no one could ignore: infections with no clear cause, fractures that shouldn't have happened, illnesses that lingered far too long.

Her family lived in a suspense that most parents of medically complex children are familiar with: knowing something is wrong, but not knowing what. Years of specialist referrals, imaging appointments, and hallway consultations that ended with more questions than answers.

When the diagnosis finally came — a rare genetic disorder with no cure and limited treatment options — it brought both clarity and its own kind of grief.

As her medical team built out her treatment plan, one element stood alongside medications, monitoring, and ongoing clinical support: a prescribed wish.

Research shows — and doctors know — that *Wishes Are Medicine*. Wishes are an evidence-informed intervention that helps children cope with the realities of illness and treatment. They can reduce stress, improve adherence to treatment, reduce emergency room visits, and support better health outcomes.

For Millie, her wish “to see dolphins” became part of her treatment plan and gave her the strength to get through her hardest moments.

Medical Wish Funds: Expanding Access Through Targeted Care

In 2025, Make-A-Wish Canada launched two new medical funds offering donors an opportunity to respond to distinct areas of medical need: rare diseases and cancer.

Rare and Genetic Disease Fund — One in 25 children is born with a rare inherited condition. Yet only five percent of children have access to effective treatment options. This new fund ensures equitable access to the health benefits a prescribed wish provides, for children with the most complex medical needs. Alexion Charitable Foundation, a leader in the rare disease community, is the inaugural funder.

Cancer Wish Fund — Nearly 50% of all wish kids have a cancer diagnosis. The Cancer Wish Fund was created to meet this high and sustained demand, ensuring eligible children with cancer can access the hope, healing and improved health outcomes a wish experience offers. CIBC and Lundin Mining are the inaugural funders.

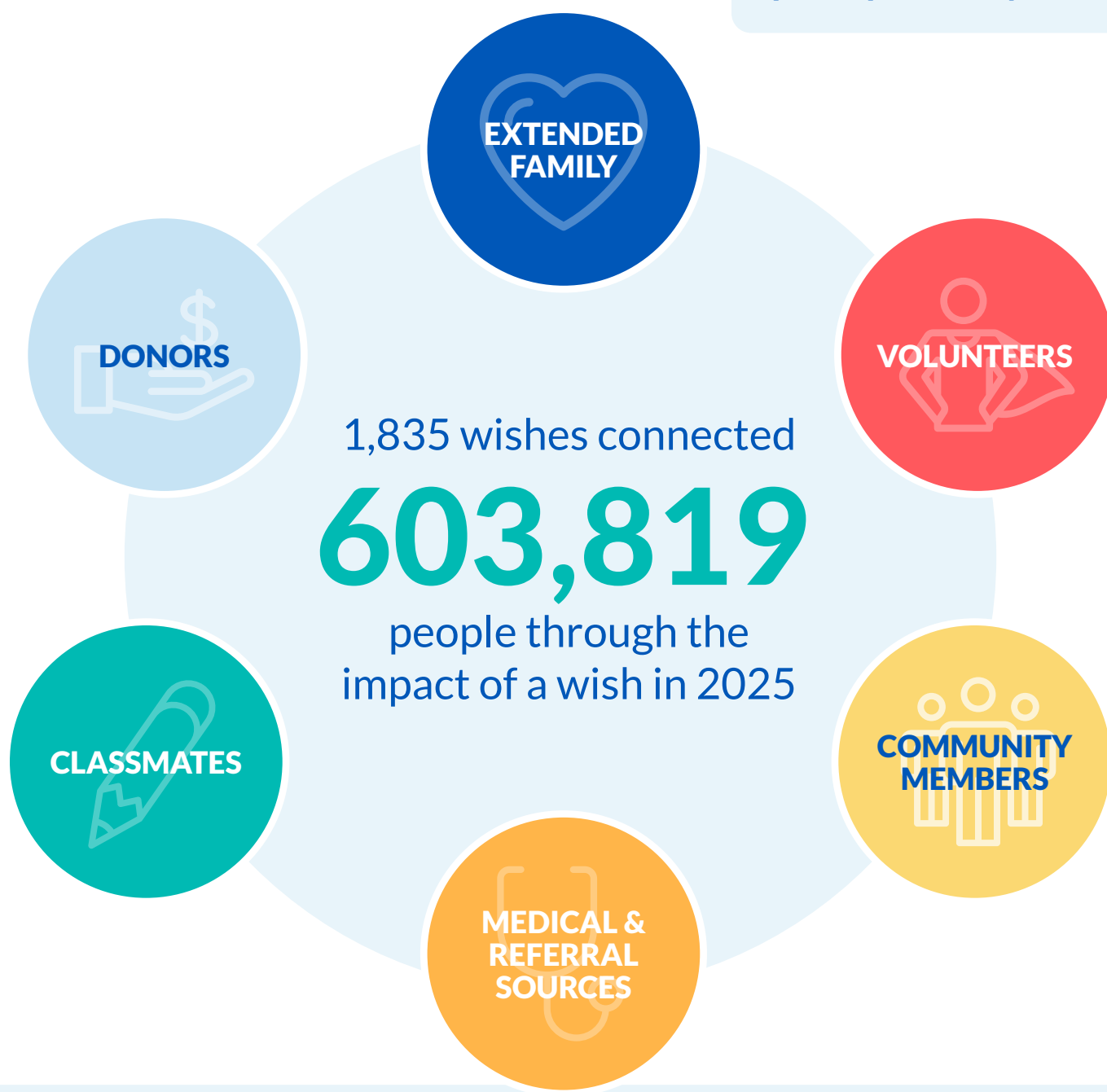
His prescribed wish reflects the one comfort that has stayed constant through every appointment and procedure — helping him get through treatment.

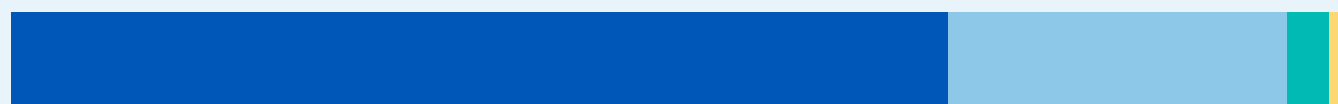

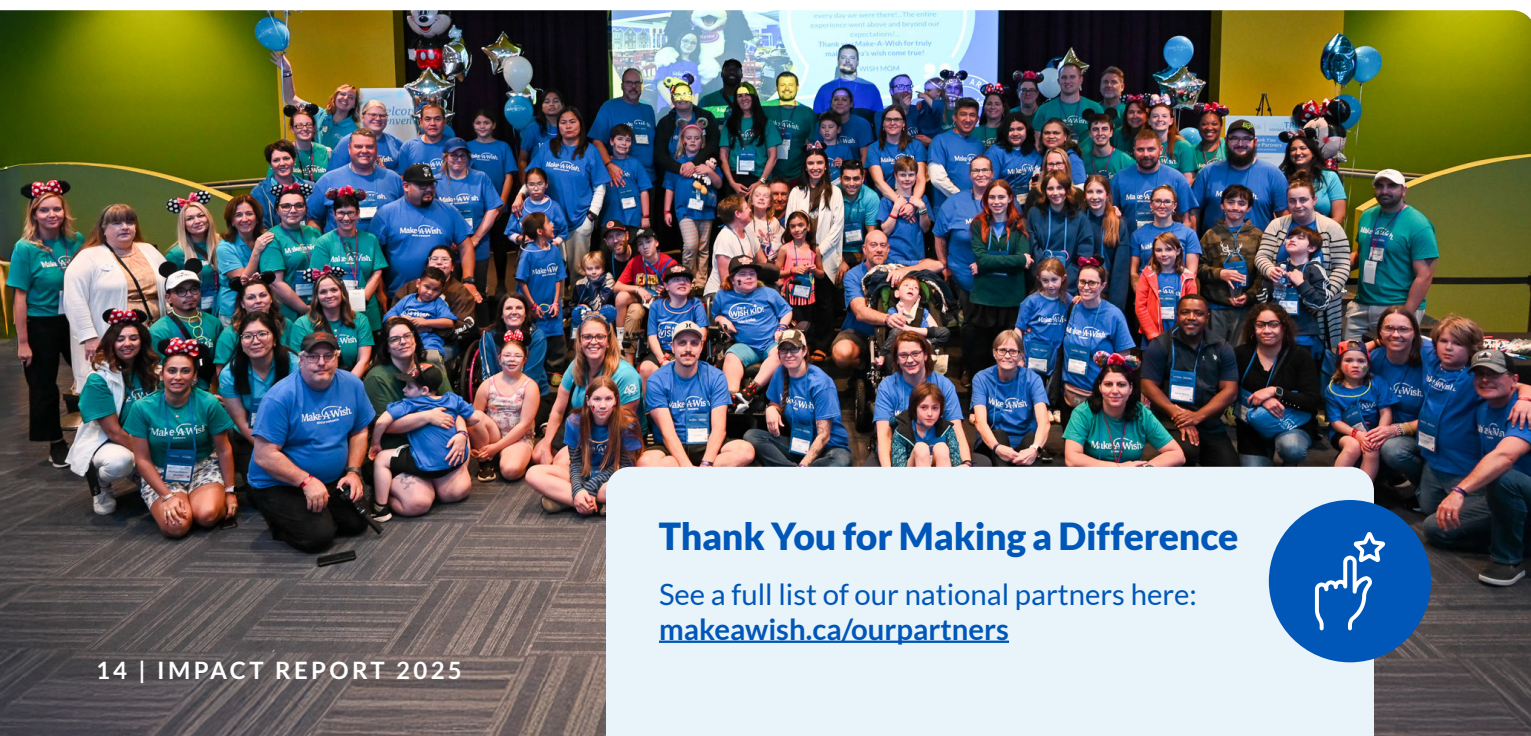
Group Wish Trips: Mission Champions Make It Possible

Local Heroes: Lights, Sirens, Wishes

Through Local Heroes, firefighters, police officers, paramedics, and other emergency responders come together to support wish kids in communities across Canada. In 2025, the program raised over \$82,000 in support of life-changing wishes.



Heroes Challenge: Ready, Captain?

Heroes Challenge brings together teams led by wish kids to take part in friendly competition while raising funds for life-changing wishes. Across four provinces, participants committed to raising \$10,000 per team, collectively raising nearly \$350,000 nationally in support of wishes as part of children's treatment journeys.

Our Financial Strategy: Strong, Stable, Sustainable

Over the past three years, Make-A-Wish Canada has worked tirelessly to accelerate wish delivery, ensuring children who waited through the pandemic could finally experience the healing power of a wish. This effort was supported by strong fundraising and the thoughtful, time-limited use of reserve funds that had increased during the pandemic.

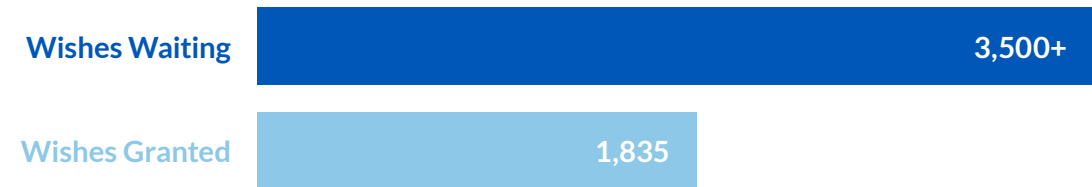
Pandemic travel restrictions and the timing of our 2019 national merger temporarily increased reserves. Under strong financial governance, these funds have been used exactly as intended — to advance delayed wishes and maintain continuity of services as we transitioned out of an extraordinary period of demand.

To ensure long-term sustainability, we are now stabilizing wish delivery at a level of 1,800–1,850 wishes annually. This approach ensures each wish continues to deliver meaningful impact while we continue to build fundraising strength and respond to the complex needs of children we serve.

Aligned with our national strategy, we increased fundraising to \$54.5M — \$4M higher than FY2024 — rebuilt operational stability after two years of accelerated delivery, invested in essential technology infrastructure to strengthen mission and fundraising systems, and reduced reserve use as planned. This multi-year strategy balances sustainability with mission delivery and reflects evidence-based standards for children with complex medical needs. It positions us for steady, reliable impact in the years ahead, because *Wishes Are Medicine*.

Too Many Children Are Still Waiting For Their Wish

In 2025, we granted 1,835 wishes! But with more children being referred everyday, we’re only reaching 34.4% of those in need. **Together, we can close the gap.**

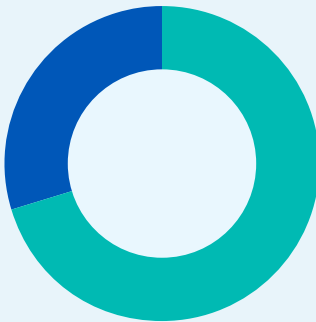
